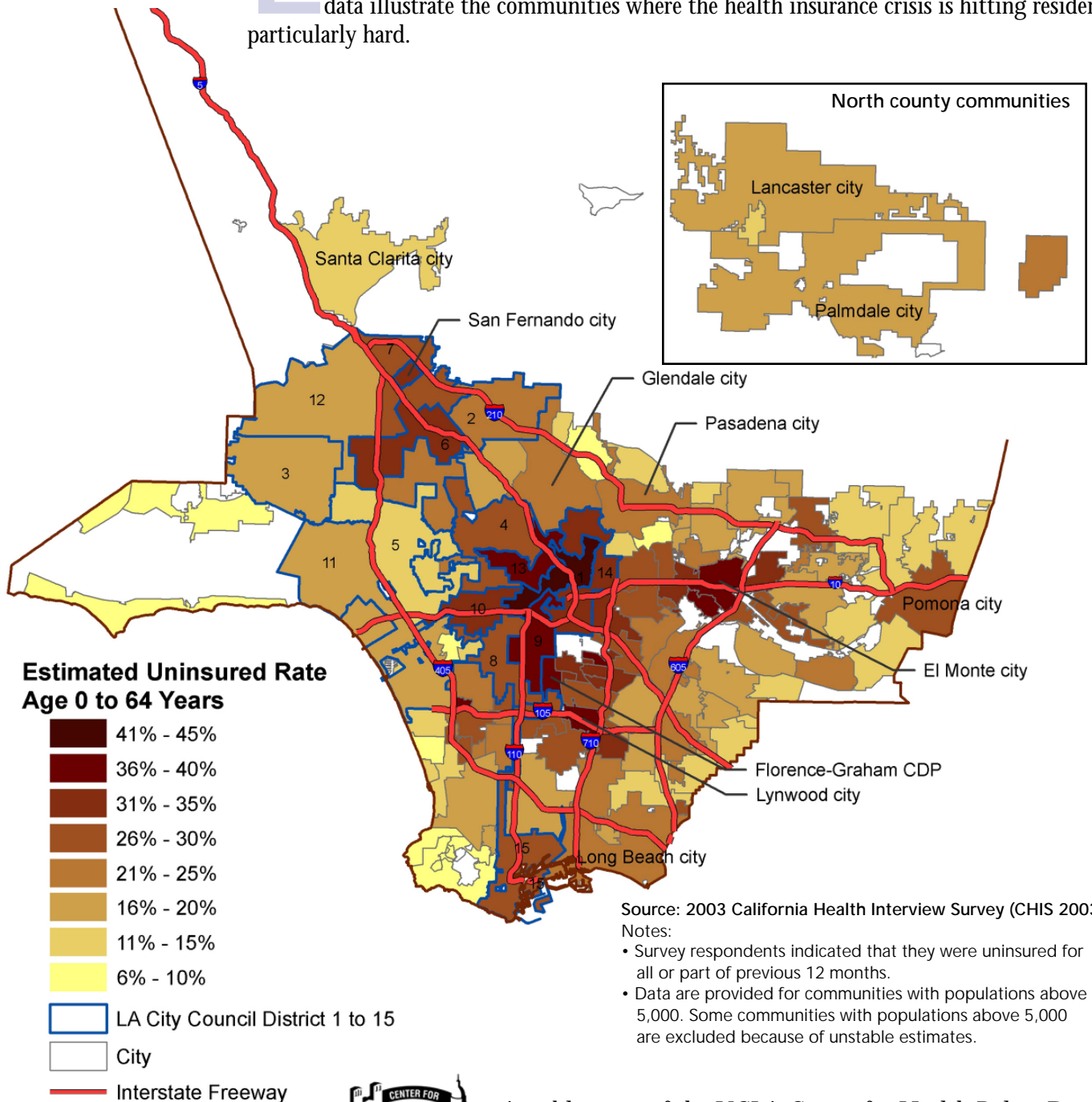


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## Concentrations of Uninsured Residents in Los Angeles County Communities

Lack of health insurance is a problem that strikes every community in Los Angeles County. But some communities are more affected than others. The following map and data illustrate the communities where the health insurance crisis is hitting residents particularly hard.

### Data Sources and Methods

The information provided in this fact sheet is based on findings from the 2003 California Health Interview Survey (CHIS 2003). Small-area modeled estimates were created using CHIS 2003 data and zip code level variables extracted from Census 2000. A detailed description of the methodology used in this study is available from the authors.

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
