## california health interview survey

CHIS 2001 completed 55,428 adult interviews statewide, 5,801 interviews with adolescents, ages 12-17, and 12,592 interviews with parents of young children (under age 12). A total of 73,821 telephone interviews were conducted in one of six available languages. A county or group of counties make up a "sampling stratum" for which a target number of adult interviews was predetermined based on the original sample design.
